Development:

Walkways between new developments

A skate ramp

Infrastructure:

Drainage/piping in ditches/ soak aways and balancing/retention/
attenuation ponds
Better, faster broadband especially for those working from home.

Flora and Fauna:

Maintenance of hedgerows and trees
Removal of established hedgerows and trees, especially the red
hawthorns
Dangerous holes in the Byways and Highways
